RESOLUTION NO. 08-508

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLACK DIAMOND, KING COUNTY, WASHINGTON AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A LATECOMERS AGREEMENT WITH BLACK DIAMOND DEVELOPMENT, LLC

WHEREAS, Black Diamond Development, LLC (the "Developer") has installed, at its own expense, improvements to the City's water system consisting of installation of a 12" waterline in 3rd Avenue (the "Improvements") from the southern boundary of parcel no. 112069095 to the northern boundary of the Diamond Square property, parcel no. 1121069069; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to RCW 35.91.020, the Developer has requested that the City contract with it for reimbursement of a portion of the construction costs of the Improvements from properties that will benefit from the Improvements, to be paid to the City and remitted to the Developer at the time said properties connect to the city's water system; and

WHEREAS, the Council finds that parcels with frontage on 3rd Avenue where the Improvements are located will benefit from the increased fire flow capacity of the 12-inch water line, except for property zoned R-9600; and

WHEREAS, the Council finds that the front footage method as calculated in Exhibit E of the Latecomer's Agreement is a reasonable and fair method of calculating the pro-rata share of the costs of the Improvements; and

WHEREAS, the Council finds that the attached Latecomer's Agreement would benefit the City of Black Diamond and is in compliance with RCW 35.91; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED that the Mayor is authorized and directed to enter into the Latecomers Agreement attached hereto, and directs that the Agreement be recorded with the King County recorder's office within 30 days from the date of this resolution.

WATER SYSTEM IMPROVEMENT COST REIMBURSEMENT AGREEMENT

<u>Date & Parties.</u> This Agreement is dated the _____ date of _____, 2008, and is entered into by and between the City of Black Diamond, a Municipal corporation of the State of Washington, hereinafter referred to as the "City," and Black Diamond Development Company, LLC a Washington limited liability company, hereinafter referred to as the "Developer."

GENERAL RECITIALS

- A. The City owns and operates a municipal water system (the "System").
- B. The Developer made certain improvements to the System ("Improvements") in order to provide water service for the Developer's development known as Diamond Square.
- C. The Improvements consist of installation of a 12" waterline in 3rd Avenue from the southern boundary of parcel no. 1121069095 to the northern boundary of the Diamond Square property, parcel no. 1121069069. The location of the Improvements can be identified in Exhibit D attached hereto and by reference incorporated herein.
- D. The Developer, pursuant to RCW 35.91.020, may contract with the City for reimbursement of a portion of the construction costs of the Improvements from Benefited Non-Contributing Properties, as defined below, to be paid to the City and remitted to the Developer at the time said properties connect to the System.

E. The City Council, by Resolution No. _____, has authorized the Mayor to execute this Agreement.

THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises of the parties and other good and valuable consideration, the parties hereby agree as follows:

AGREEMENT

- 1. <u>Cost of Construction</u>. The cost of construction of the Improvements was Five Hundred Eighty Three Thousand One Hundred Twenty Two and 99/100 Dollars (\$583,122.99), including sales tax ("Cost of Construction"). An itemization of the Cost of Construction is set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto.
- 2. <u>Benefited Contributing Properties</u>. Those properties legally described in Exhibit B attached hereto, are owned by the Developer and are considered benefited contributing properties ("Benefited Contributing Properties") and thus will not be assessed reimbursement charges pursuant to the terms on this Agreement.
- 3. <u>Benefited Non-Contributing Properties</u>. The Benefited Non-Contributing Properties that are subject to reimbursement charges under this Agreement are set forth and legally described in Exhibit C attached hereto. A map of the Benefited Contributing Parties and Benefited Non-Contributing Parties is attached hereto as Exhibit D. The Benefited Non-Contributing Properties all have frontage on 3rd Avenue where the Improvements are located, and will benefit from the increased fire flow capacity of the 12-inch water line. Parcel No. 1121069085 is currently zoned R-9600, and shall be exempt from assessment under this Agreement so long as the zoning remains R-9600. The exemption shall be lifted upon any zoning change that increases the density or intensity of allowed uses.
- 4. <u>Amount of Assessment</u>. The amount of assessment against the Benefited Non-Contributing Properties that tap into or otherwise connect to the System after the date this Agreement is recorded shall be the amount set forth in Exhibit E. The assessment was calculated by multiplying the ratio of each parcel's frontage on 3rd Avenue where the new water line is located to the total length of such frontage of all Benefited Contributing and Noncontributing Properties, by the total Cost of Construction. The calculation of the assessment is also set forth in Exhibit E. The total assessment per foot of front frontage is \$124.14.
- 5. <u>Administrative Costs</u>. There shall be an administrative fee of twenty percent (20%) of all Assessments collected by the City under this Agreement, charged to the Developer in order to reimburse the City for its costs incurred in processing this Agreement and administering the terms thereof. The administrative fee shall be deducted from Assessments collected by the City prior to remittance to the Developer.

- 6. <u>Collection and Reimbursement</u>. The City shall collect, prior to allowing any Benefited Non-Contributing Property described in Exhibit C and D to connect to the System after the date of recording of this Agreement, in addition to all other applicable charges, the assessment amount set forth in Exhibit E, and shall remit the assessment amount, less the City's administrative fee, to the Developer or its designated successor within sixty (60) days after the receipt thereof.
- 7. <u>Termination of the Right to Reimbursement</u>. The Developer's right to collect the sums to become due and owing under the terms of this Agreement shall terminate on the 5th of June, 2018, upon the Developer having been paid Four Hundred Thirty Two Thousand Six Hundred Thirty Three and 42/100 Dollars (\$432,633.42), or upon the City having redesigned and reconstructed a part of the System so that the Improvements constructed by the Developer are rendered useless, whichever shall sooner occur.
- 8. Recording. The City Clerk shall record this Agreement with the King County Recorder's Office within 30 days from the date of this Agreement and may also record such other notices as are necessary to put owners of the Benefited Non-Contributing Properties on notice as to the assessments referred to herein.

The Developer shall provide the City with current name, address, and telephone number every two years. If the Developer fails to comply with the notification requirements of this section within sixty days of the specified time, and the City is unable to locate the Developer, then the City may retain any reimbursement funds owed to the Developer under this Agreement. Such funds must be deposited in the City's capital fund.

B. All notices to be sent to the City shall be sent to the City at the following address:

- 10. Covenant Running With the Land. This Agreement shall be binding on the City and the Developer and their respective successors, grantees and assignees and shall also be binding on the owners of the Benefited Non-Contributing Properties, their heirs, successors, grantees and assigns. This Agreement shall constitute a covenant running with all of the Benefited Non-Contributing Properties and the Benefited Contributing Properties; provided, however, that the Developer, upon giving written notice to the City, may assign its rights and delegate its duties under this Agreement to any person. In the event of such assignment, the assignee shall have all of the rights, duties and obligations of the Developer under this Agreement.
- 11. <u>Severability</u>. If any court or tribunal declares any provision of this Agreement to be invalid, the remaining provisions of this Agreement shall not be affected thereby. This Agreement, or any part hereof, if determined by law to be invalid, shall not waive any rights the Developer has to reimbursement of the costs of construction of the Improvements to the extent provided for in this Agreement.



The City of Black Diamond's Water System Plan (Plan) provides a long-term planning strategy for the City's water system over the six- and twenty-year planning periods. The objectives of the plan are to evaluate the performance and adequacy of the existing City water system, to determine what will be necessary to meet the infrastructure demands for the next twenty years, and to identify compliance issues that may affect operation of the water system. The Plan was prepared in accordance with the Washington Administrative Code (WAC) 246-290.

In June 2007 the Council authorized a contract with PacWest Engineering to prepare the Water System Comprehensive Plan. The comprehensive plan describes the existing water system, identifies deficiencies in the existing system, makes projections on future needs to accommodate growth, and identifies a suggested Capital Improvement Plan to correct deficiencies and provide for future growth.

As required by the Washington Administrative Code (WAC), the plans have been reviewed by Tacoma Water, the Covington Water District and Soos Creek as adjoining purveyors. The City's Public Works/Streets Committee has reviewed the plan on several occasions and the plan was made available to council members for review preceding and following a May 1, 2008, study session. The plan now needs to be transmitted to the Department of Health.

A staff report summarizing the changes and the altered pages since the study session are attached.

COMMITTEE REVIEW AND RECOMMENDATION:

The plan has been reviewed by the Public Works/Streets Committee, which recommends submittal to the Department of Health.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: MOTION to adopt Resolution No. 08-512, authorizing the Mayor to transit 2008 Water System Plan to the Department of Health.

City of Black Diamond Council Staff Report Water System Plan Update

Council Meeting - Thursday, June 5, 2008

BACKGROUND

PacWest Engineering updated the Water System Plan in accordance with comments received from the City of Black Diamond, Tacoma Water, Covington Water, and King County. This plan was resubmitted to the City in April 2008. Council members received an e-mail on April 30th from Gwendolyn Voelpel which included a copy of the table of contents, the executive summary, and key pages (policies and improvement projects) for your review. A copy of the entire water system plan was also available on CD if interested. Approval of the Water System Plan and the authorization to forward the plan to the Department of Health is an agenda item on June 5, 2008.

The Public Works Council Committee of Geoff Bowie and Kristine Hanson had additional comments, and a meeting was convened with City staff, Councilmembers Bowie and Hanson, and PacWest Engineering on May 14th.

WATER SYSTEM PLAN MODIFICATIONS

The following items were modified as a result of the May 14th meeting:

- 1. **Executive Summary:** The plan stated that the moratorium will be lifted in "early 2008". This was updated to "late 2008".
- 2. Future Service Area Boundary: The boundary of the "future service area" was originally established during a meeting between PacWest Engineering, City staff, Councilmember Bowie, and former Councilmember Sorci during the fall of 2007. As a result of discussions held on May 14th, this boundary was revised to better reflect the areas that the City anticipated to be developed and to be served by City water in the future.
- 3. System Policies: System policies were modified as follows:
 - a. **Oversizing Policy:** Language was updated to clarify the reference was to future development.
 - b. **Extension Policy:** Language "It is recommended that the City establish a formal policy regarding extensions to the Water System." was revised to read "It is recommended that the City establish a formal policy regarding extensions to the Water System within the future service area."
 - c. Additional System Policies: Language "Track the total water hook-ups to the water system..." was revised to read "Track the total water connections (and ERUs) to the water system...".



- 4. System Standards: Standards were modified as follows:
 - a. Valve and Hydrant Spacing: Requirement for hydrant spacing was updated from a spacing every 600' to every 500' in conformance with the recent Public Works standards. This also affected the spacing on dead end streets which was updated from 300' to 250'.
 - b. **Sampling Stations:** Language was modified from "One water sampling station shall be provided for developments in size of five to ten lots." To "One water sampling station shall be provided for developments of five or more lots."
- 5. **Response to Review Comments**: In the section discussing the classification of the City's source of supply as a spring field, the reference to the Department of Ecology was corrected to the Department of Health.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This City of Black Diamond Water System Plan provides a long-term planning document for the City of Black Diamond's water system. It evaluates the system over a twenty-year planning horizon, and develops a list of recommended project improvements with a six-year financing plan. This plan has been prepared in accordance with Department of Health requirements as outlined in the Washington Administrative Code Chapter 246-290.

The Black Diamond water system is primarily served by the Black Diamond Spring Field, located approximately two miles southeast of the City. Water from the Black Diamond Spring Field is pumped to a 4.3 MG Reservoir by an electric pump station located on the north side of the river. An additional source of water for the City is a recent intertie with the City of Tacoma Second Supply Pipe Line (SSPL).

The City has two reservoirs which serve the City of Black Diamond. The City's distribution system currently operates with three pressure zones – the upper pressure zone at a pressure head of approximately 965 feet, the middle pressure zone at a pressure head of approximately 850 feet, and the lower pressure zone at a pressure head of approximately 750 feet. The system operates with high pressures, so there are individual pressure-reducing valves (PRV's) on all service connections throughout the city. The transmission and distribution system for the City consists of 108,000 lineal feet of pipe ranging from less than 2-inches to 20-inches.

The City of Black Diamond currently serves 846 connections, over 94% of which are single-family residences. The City has been under a development moratorium for several years which is expected to be removed in late 2008. The City is anticipating that several large master-planned communities will submit development applications in the near future. The City is preparing to experience substantial growth. The City's water system is expected to expand from serving 1,130 Equivalent Residential Unit's (ERU's) in 2007 to serving over 9,300 ERU's in 2027.

A complete hydraulic analysis of the system has been conducted and numerous projects are recommended to improve the system. Projects selected for the program are: 1) Growth related projects associated with extensions to the existing system in order to serve proposed new development; 2) Growth related projects associated with upsizing and improving portions of the existing system that will not be able to adequately serve the system with the anticipated growth; 3) System improvements to address existing system deficiencies such as inabilities to meet minimum fire flow requirements; 4) Projects to replace small-lines that are 4-inches and smaller; and 5) Projects to replace waterlines constructed of Asbestos Cement material.

A six-year funding program has been developed using three funding sources: 1) Projects to be funded outright by development as extensions to the system; 2) Projects to be funded by connection charges to the existing system to address growth-related deficiencies; and 3) Projects to be funded by customer rates to address existing system deficiencies.

The City of Black Diamond is committed to providing its customers with a safe and reliable source of drinking water. The City is anticipating substantial growth in population over the twenty-year planning period and this plan provides a means for ensuring that the City water system is able to accommodate current and future customers.

There are currently 846 metered service connections within the City of Black Diamond. 792 (over 93%) of these connections are for single family residences. The remaining meters are for public buildings and facilities, multi-family residences, a mobile home park, and commercial businesses.

TELEMETRY & CONTROL SYSTEM

A telemetry and supervisory control system collects information and can efficiently control a water system by automatically optimizing facility operations. The telemetry and control system is capable of providing alarm notifications in the event of equipment failure, reservoir overflow, or other emergency situations. The City of Black Diamond has a telemetry and control system that was put into operation in 2006. The operation of the telemetry system is controlled on-site at the 4.3 MG Reservoir.

TREATMENT FACILITIES

The Black Diamond water system is currently disinfected via a hypochloride chlorination system at the North Bank Pump Station. Corrosion treatment is provided at the pump station located at the 4.3 MG reservoir site.

EXISTING SERVICE AREA & CHARACTERISTICS

WATER SERVICE AREA




Figure 2.7, Water Service Area

The boundaries of the Black Diamond Water System's retail and future service areas are depicted in *Figure 2.7. Water Service Area.*

Retail Service Area

The Municipal Water Supply – Efficiency Requirements Act, Chapter 5, Laws of 2003 (Municipal Water Law), amended the State Board of Health Code (RCW 43.20) to require that municipal water suppliers provide water service to all new retail customers within a retail service area under certain conditions. A retail service area is the area within which water is or will be sold directly to the ultimate consumers.

According to the Municipal Water Law, a municipal water supplier has a duty to serve new water service within the identified retail service area if the utility meets the criteria listed below. Black Diamond meets these criteria and thus has a duty to serve within the retail service area.

- Can provide water service in a timely and reasonable manner;
- Has sufficient water rights, or uses water from a source that has a water right;
- Has sufficient capacity to serve the water in a safe and reliable manner as determined by the Department of Health; and
- Is consistent with the requirements of any comprehensive plans or development regulations adopted under RCW 36.70A or any other applicable adopted comprehensive plans, land use plans, or development regulations.

February 1989 and the highest recorded temperature was 102° F in August 1981 and May 1983.

Prevailing wind direction is from the south to the southwest during the rainy season and from the west or northwest in summer. Average wind velocity is less than 10 mph.

Mining Activity

Abandoned coal mines underlie at least 50,000 acres in western and central Washington. Many of the abandoned, underground mines present in the Black Diamond area have been documented by the State. Applicants for building permits in abandoned coal mine areas are required to demonstrate the safety of the proposed project. Mitigation of a mine may be required, and a horizontal buffer of 500 feet from the vertical projection of the mine is required, regardless of depth, unless otherwise recommended by a geotechnical report by a professional engineer with expertise in geotechnical engineering. High hazard areas are typically those areas underlain by mine workings shallower than 200 feet or fifteen times the knees of the coal seam for gently dipping seams. Moderate hazard areas are areas where more workings are deeper than 200 feet or deeper than fifteen times the knees of the seam or workings for gently dipping seams. The study by professional engineers should detail the presence of surface openings, potential sinkholes, depth of working, and a detailed examination of historic mine maps and records.

Environmentally Sensitive Areas

The Black Diamond Municipal Code Chapter 19.12 establishes regulations for development in environmentally sensitive areas. These regulations were developed in order to prevent action undertaken by any person or entity resulting in a substantial environmental alteration. Specific information on the location and extent of sensitive areas within the City can be obtained from the City while sensitive area information for other areas is available from King County. Any development should be coordinated with the City's Wellhead Protection Map.

Environmentally sensitive areas include wetlands, fish and wildlife habitat conservation areas and geologically hazardous areas. Geologically hazardous areas include areas that are not suitable to development due to their susceptibility to erosion, sliding, earthquake or other geological events. A geotechnical report prepared by a licensed professional engineer is required prior to any development in these areas.

Fish and wildlife conservation areas within the City include Rock Creek and Ginder Creek corridors, open water ponds, lakes and riparian forests. Geologically hazardous areas include steep slopes (greater than 25%) and past coal mine working areas. Development around wetland areas requires buffer zones in order to reduce or mitigate any adverse impact. Permitted activities within the buffer zones include passive recreation, parks, pedestrian and bicycle trails and road and utility facilities when necessary.

ZONING & LAND USE

Land use and zoning play an important role in determining growth patterns, and therefore future water requirements. Future land use, variations in use, and changing population densities, as determined by applicable zoning ordinances, can significantly impact the City of Black Diamond's ability to provide adequate water service.

Figure 2.8, City of Black Diamond Draft Land Use is the proposed land use for the City as included in the City of Black Diamond Draft Comprehensive Plan. This figure shows designated land use within incorporated Black Diamond and the portions of unincorporated King County that are within the City's water service area. Current land uses are primarily residential uses, with some light industrial and commercial areas.

Figure 2.9, Unincorporated King County Land Use includes the designated land uses for the area of unincorporated King County within the Black Diamond water service area. Figure 2.10, King County Zoning includes the zoning designations as defined by King County.

FUTURE SERVICE AREA

The City of Black Diamond's future service area has been modified from the previous future water service area as identified in the South King County Coordinated Water System Plan (SKCCWSP). The SKCCWSP established future water service areas for the utilities that are included in the plan. A service area agreement was prepared by the South King County Water Utilities Coordinating Committee (SKCWUCC) and agreed to by the participating utilities. A copy of the "Interlocal Agreement for Establishing Water Utility Service Area Boundaries as Identified by the South King County Coordinated Water System Plan" has been included in *Appendix J – SKC-CWSP Service Area Agreement*.

The City of Black Diamond has proposed a modified boundary of their Future Service Area. This boundary is more representative of geographic conditions and more accurately reflects where development may occur. The adjustment of this boundary will not affect adjacent purveyors, with the exception of the small portion along the City's western boundary which has been previously discussed in this plan. The City of Black Diamond is committed to working with King County on a future update of the South King County Coordinated Water System Plan to ensure that this updated boundary is reflected properly.

In general, the future service area for Black Diamond expands the service area to the east and to the south which are unincorporated, rural areas. If development were to occur, the City of Black Diamond would likely be the provider of service in this area. It is unforeseeable that development of the future service area will occur within the near future; however, the City of Black Diamond recognizes its obligation to consider extension of service to any developing parcel requiring water

WATER QUALITY ANALYSIS

WATER QUALITY STANDARDS

The City of Black Diamond is required to conform to numerous Department of Health Water Quality Standards as outlined in WAC 246-290. These requirements are applicable to all sources of supply.

As the demand for additional water grows, the use of the Tacoma Intertie will increase. Currently this source is only used on occasion to ensure that water is not stagnated in the line. The City may wish to conduct sampling to ensure that taste/flavor issues are not introduced into the City's water system as a result of source mixing.

Coliform Bacteria

"Coliform bacteria are a large group of bacteria that occur throughout the environment. They are used as an indicator organism to indicate the potential for disease-causing bacteria to be present in water. In other words, if coliform bacteria are present, it is presumed that a contamination pathway exists between the bacteria source and the water supply and disease-causing bacteria may use this pathway to enter the water supply.

Most coliform bacteria do not cause disease, but the greater their number the greater the likelihood that disease-causing bacteria may be present. Since coliform bacteria stay in water longer than most disease-causing organisms, the absence of coliform bacteria leads to the assumption that the water supply is microbiologically safe to drink. Consuming water with coliform bacteria present may cause gastrointestinal illnesses, fever, and other flu-like symptoms. Therefore, the drinking water standard requires that no coliform bacteria be present in public drinking water supplies." ⁸

Table 4.2, Microbiological Contaminants includes common microbiological contaminants that are required to be monitored for drinking water quality standards in Washington State.

- Primary vs. supplemental does not appear so
 - o Comment noted. No action required.
- Instream flow constraints -- yes for WRIA 9 (perhaps link to discussion on page 2-12), seems
 that if spring #4 is thought of as a potential source of water a water right application should
 be filed with Ecology. Same idea for referenced ground water on the Black Diamond

Conservation

 Documented conservation measures and consistency w/DOH guidance – Conservation program is consistent with DOH and does not meet countywide policy CO-6 or recently promulgated water use efficiency rule, or the South King County CWSP goals. The Conservation Program section on page 5-2 says the goal is to reduce per capita consumption and that is great. However, there is no discussion of what the goal is or how it will be accomplished. We recommend Black Diamond document a numeric goal for efficiency of water use for both supply and demand sectors as required by DOH rules.

- o Specific, measurable goals for water conservation have been included in the projected water demands included in Chapter 3.
- It also does not appear future demand projections (see table 3.9 on page 3-6) was reduced in any way from the effects of conservation.
 - o Future demand projections have been updated to reflect conservation efforts.
- No source metering for many years. King County assumes that problem has been corrected? Appears that gallons per day per ERU is going up (approximately 10 percent increase from 2002 2003) is there any reason why?
 - The City is pursuing correction to the source metering problems. The consumption per ERU does appear to be increasing, however there is such a lack of accurate consumption and production data that it is assumed that this is incorrect.
- Aggressive pursuit (per KC Comp Plan) no reliable information to demonstrate aggressive
 pursuit of conservation therefore not done. Has Black Diamond been aggressive in pursuit of
 conservation of water? If yes, please provide data to demonstrate.
 - o Black Diamond has actively been pursuing conservation; however it is difficult to provide measurable data due to the inaccuracies in the production/consumption data. Language has been added to the plan recommending that the City become more aggressive in their pursuit of conservation.
- Rate structure (RCW 43.20.235): block rates, subsidies. Unknown, but appears to be flat rate. How is Black Diamond complying with RCW 43.20.235?
 - o The City of Black Diamond is currently conducting a water rate study. The current rate structure is a flat rate and has not been updated in quite a few years. The City is evaluating several alternatives for rate adoption that encourage conservation.
- Cost-effective evaluation; measures not implemented (per Section 5(2) MWL) no evaluation,
 - A detailed evaluation of the cost-effectiveness of the City's conservation program has not been included in the plan. Costs of the program will be taken into consideration when completing the current water rate study.
- Plans for WUE DOH rule compliance- nothing in WSP, please address DOH requirements in recently adopted rule.
 - o A discussion of the City's Water Use Efficiency Program has been added to Chapter 5 of the plan.
- Leakage rate and plans no data for many years therefore no ability to assess.
 - o Comment noted. No action required. There is not sufficient information to address in plan.

Reclaimed Water

- Identification of opportunities for reclaimed water (per MWL) no, but Black Diamond is below threshold for reporting under ch. 90.46 RCW.
 - o Comment noted. No action required. Below threshold.
- Specific applications (golf courses, athletic fields) unknown, is there any opportunity?

The City of Black Diamond has retained the services of PacWest Engineering for various high-level engineering services, including development of the 2008 stormwater management program to accompany the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) annual report. The City currently has a need for additional services to meet the Department of Ecology's requirements for the NPDES Phase II permit. Required components of the program are: public education and outreach; public involvement and participation; illicit discharge detection and elimination; controlling runoff from new development and redevelopment; and pollution prevention and operation and maintenance for municipal operations. This resolution would authorize PacWest Engineering's development of the requested stormwater management plan to include the formation of a stormwater utility and establishment of stormwater utility rates and impact fees, as well as comprehensive stormwater planning services.

COMMITTEE REVIEW AND RECOMMENDATION: Members of the Surface Water Committee of the Council have reviewed the proposed scope of work and recommended it be brought forward to Council for consideration.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLACK DIAMOND, KING COUNTY, WASHINGTON, AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE AMENDMENT #5 TO THE PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT BETWEEN PACWEST ENGINEERING AND THE CITY OF BLACK DIAMOND

WHEREAS, the City of Black Diamond's National Pollutant Discharge and Elimination System permit requires the adoption of a stormwater management plan; and

WHEREAS, the Stormwater Management Plan must include five elements: public education and outreach; public involvement and participation; illicit discharge detection and elimination; controlling runoff from new development and redevelopment; and pollution prevention and maintenance and operations for municipal operations; and

WHEREAS, the City adopted the 2008 Stormwater Management Plan at its May 15, 2008, meeting to include the required elements; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to retain the services of a consultant skilled in engineering services including stormwater utility planning and development; and

WHEREAS, the proposed scope of work includes storm system inventory and basin identification, modeling of existing conditions and future growth conditions, identification of system deficiencies and capital program development, and development of an operations and maintenance program, illicit discharge detection and elimination program, public education and outreach program, and low impact development quidelines, as well as stormwater rate and impact fee analysis; and

WHEREAS, the City of Black Diamond has an ongoing contractual relationship with PacWest Engineering to provide engineering services as authorized in Resolution 07-453; and

WHEREAS, PacWest is qualified, willing and able to perform the above-mentioned services; now therefore:

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLACK DIAMOND, WASHINGTON, DOES RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> The Mayor is authorized to execute amendment #5 to the professional services agreement with PacWest Engineering for stormwater utility development and comprehensive planning as contained in form attached hereto as Exhibit A.

Black Diamond Stormwater Utility Development and Comprehensive Planning Scope of Work

May 20, 2008

PacWest Engineering is pleased to submit this revised proposal to provide Civil Engineering services for a stormwater utility development and comprehensive stormwater planning for the City of Black Diamond. This proposal has been developed based on our conversations with City staff, as well as our professional recommendations for your community.

It is understood that the City of Black Diamond is operating under a NPDES Phase II permit. One of the requirements of this permit is that the City of Black Diamond implement a Stormwater Management Program. Required components of this program, per the permit, are:

- 1) Public Education and Outreach
- 2) Public Involvement and Participation
- 3) Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination
- 4) Controlling Runoff from New Development, Redevelopment, and Construction Sites
- 5) Pollution Prevention and Operation and Maintenance for Municipal Operations

PacWest Engineering has proposed the following scope of services for the preparation of a Stormwater Comprehensive Plan which addresses these topics to assist the City of Black Diamond with compliance of their NPDES Phase II requirements. The proposed scope of services includes the formation of a stormwater utility and establishment of stormwater utility rates and impact fees, as well as the comprehensive stormwater planning services.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

Task 1 - Project Management and Coordination

PacWest Engineering will provide general project management and coordination required to provide utility development and comprehensive planning services that meet applicable regulations and serve the needs of the City. This task includes such items as coordination with City staff and internal team communications.

Task 2 - Formation of Stormwater Utility

PacWest Engineering advises that a stormwater utility fund be established concurrent with approval of the scope of work outlined in this proposal. Creation of the utility should be completed immediately so that all work completed under this scope of work is eligible for reimbursement from this fund. PacWest Engineering will coordinate with City staff for preparation of the required ordinance by the City attorney. PacWest Engineering will be available to present this issue to the City Council for approval.

Task 3 – Stormwater Comprehensive Plan

PacWest Engineering will develop a stormwater comprehensive plan for the City of Black Diamond. The following are included in the scope of services to be provided for completion of this task:

Storm System Inventory & Basin Identification

PacWest Engineering will conduct a field survey of all stormwater facilities within the City. It is understood that the information collected will include the physical location (and invert elevations) of all stormwater facilities such as catch basins, manholes, and ponds, as well as size, type, and location of conveyance pipes. It is assumed that this information will be available in a digital mapping format providing horizontal and vertical data including pipe invert elevations. Additionally, LIDAR contour information will be associated with the stormwater facilities to assist in identifying drainage basin boundaries. Utilization of accurate system information is essential in order to ensure accurate hydraulic modeling.

Stormwater Model of Existing Conditions

PacWest Engineering will conduct a hydrologic and hydraulic analysis of the existing conditions of the City of Black Diamond stormwater system. This effort will evaluate the hydraulic capacity of the current system and identify any capacity constraints.

Stormwater Model of Future Growth Conditions

It is understood that the City of Black Diamond has been operating with a moratorium on development for several years and it is anticipated that this moratorium will be lifted soon. Furthermore, there are several large-scale master planned communities that are anticipated to be built in Black Diamond over the upcoming years. The City anticipates that the population of Black Diamond will be about 20,000 people within twenty years.

PacWest Engineering will conduct a hydrologic and hydraulic analysis of future growth conditions of the City of Black Diamond stormwater system. Growth projections utilized for future conditions will be consistent with the best available data and consistent with established land use plans.

Identification of System Deficiencies and Recommendation of Capital Improvements

PacWest Engineering will evaluate the results of the hydrologic and hydraulic analyses for both the present and future conditions and will identify existing deficiencies in the stormwater system. We will provide recommended capital improvements to address the existing and future system deficiencies. We will also provide recommendations for accommodating future stormwater quantity and quality requirements, including the use of regional ponds.

Operations and Maintenance Program

PacWest Engineering will develop a stormwater operations and maintenance program for the City of Black Diamond in compliance with NPDES Phase II Permit requirements. The operations and maintenance program will include recommended maintenance standards as well as outline inspection requirements.

Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination Program

PacWest Engineering will identify issues and recommend strategies for the City to detect and address non-stormwater discharges, spills, illicit connections, and illegal dumping into the City's stormwater system. PacWest Engineering will review the City's current ordinances and provide recommended modifications as may be appropriate.

Public Education and Outreach Program

The Stormwater Comprehensive Plan will include recommendations for the City of Black Diamond to implement in order to educate the public on the City's stormwater management policies. The plan will also include recommendations for advisory committees and other opportunities for ongoing public involvement.

Low Impact Development Guidelines

PacWest Engineering will also develop recommended Low Impact Development guidelines as a component of the Stormwater Comprehensive Plan.

PacWest Engineering will work with City staff to guide the Stormwater Comprehensive Plan through the adoption process by City Council. The scope of services for this task includes two Council Utility Committee meetings and two full Council meetings.

Task 4 - Stormwater Rates and Utility Fees

PacWest Engineering will develop planning level project costs for the recommended capital improvement projects. PacWest Engineering will conduct a stormwater utility rate and impact fee analysis to establish a financial plan for the City to complete the recommended stormwater capital improvements, as well as administrative, operational, and maintenance expenses. This establishment of a stormwater utility rate will require development of a billing database, including the filed collection of impervious areas for properties with four-plexes or larger. The scope of services for this task includes participation by PacWest Engineering at one Council Utility Committee meeting and one full Council meeting.

PROFESSIONAL STAFF

The following professionals will be the primary individuals responsible for the completion of this work for the City of Black Diamond. They will be supported by a team of engineering and surveying technicians.

Leonard L. Smith, PE/PLS will serve as the Principal in Charge and Project Manager for the Stormwater Management Program for the City of Black Diamond. He will oversee the preparation of all technical work and will participate in all meetings and presentations to the City of Black Diamond and the Council. Mr. Smith will serve as the primary point of contact for the City.

Christine J. Smith, PE will serve as the lead in the analysis and recommendations for the stormwater utility rates. She will also serve as the primary author of the Stormwater Comprehensive Plan.

L. Brandon Smith, PE will provide the lead in the technical analyses and recommendations for the Stormwater Comprehensive Plan.

Larry Onorati, PE will assist in the technical analyses and recommendations for the Stormwater Comprehensive Plan.

Matthew Ruettgers, PLS will provide the lead in the oversight of the field collection and mapping efforts.

Toby Mollet, LSIT will assist in the field collection oversight and mapping efforts.

BUDGET

PacWest Engineering proposes to complete the work as outlined in this proposal on an hourly basis, not to exceed \$145,390 as detailed on the attached spreadsheet.

It is understood that the City of Black Diamond has a \$75,000 grant from the Department of Ecology to assist the City in implementing the required steps to be in conformance with NPDES Phase II Permit requirements. Recognizing the impacts that this work may have on the City of Black Diamond's budget, PacWest Engineering is willing to enter into a phased payment schedule with the City of Black Diamond for all work not covered by the DOE grant. We would be happy to sit down and mutually agree on the terms and conditions of such a payment schedule if the City desires to pursue such an agreement.

SCHEDULE

With the upcoming removal of the development moratorium and the impending requirements of the NPDES Phase II Permit, PacWest Engineering recognizes that the City desires to have this work completed as soon as possible. In order to provide completed products to the City as quickly as possible, PacWest Engineering proposes to provide products to the City for subsequent adoption by the milestone dates listed below. These dates assume receipt of authorization to proceed by June 6, 2008.

Formation of Stormwater Utility
By July 1, 2008
Stormwater Comprehensive Plan
By November 1, 2008
Stormwater Rates and Utility Fees

By December 1, 2008 for January implementation

SUMMARY STATEMENT:

The Federal Clean Water Act and State NPDES Phase II Permit require that Cities Implement a Stormwater Planning and Management Program within stated timelines. PacWest reviewed the Stormwater Management Plan at a public hearing on May 15, 2008. They have submitted a proposal to help Black Diamond meet the five required elements.

A \$75,000 grant from Department of Ecology has been approved to pay for a portion of the costs, but it will require approximately \$100,000 more to complete the necessary requirements. A short term five year loan from the Sewer Reserve Fund to the Drainage Fund will be needed to insure that all of the components can be completed in a timely manner. Interest will accrue at the State Investment Pool rate monthly and the total amount will be due June 1, 2013. Annual principal payments can be made if a Drainage Utility Fund and rates are established and there are sufficient funds available. There will be no prepayment penalty.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLACK DIAMOND, KING COUNTY, WASHINGTON, AUTHORIZING A SHORT TERM INTERFUND LOAN FROM THE SEWER RESERVE FUND TO THE DRAINAGE FUND TO COVER THE COSTS OF STORMWATER PLANNING AND MANAGEMENT REQUIRED BY FEDERAL AND STATE MANDATES.

WHEREAS, The Federal Clean Water Act requires Cities to implement stormwater management programs within prescribed time frames, and the environmental Protection Agency, pursuant to the Federal Clean Water Act has published rules for stormwater outfall permits; and

WHEREAS, The Western Washington NPDES Phase II permit has required that Cities implement a Stormwater Management Program with five requirements; and

WHEREAS, Engineering consultants will assist the City with the Management Programs five components which are: Public Education and Outreach, Public Involvement and Participation, Illicit discharge Detection and Elimination, controlling runoff from New Development, Redevelopment and construction Sites, and Pollution Prevention and Operation and Maintenance for Municipal Operations: and

WHEREAS, there are sufficient reserve monies in the Sewer Reserve Fund to provide for an interfund loan to the Drainage Fund in the amount of \$100,000.00 and still meet the needs of the Sewer Fund; and

WHEREAS, the interfund loan shall be for a period of five years with the full principal payment of \$100,000 due on June 1, 2013. Interest shall accrue monthly at the State Pool Interest Rate. Annual payments of \$10,000 may be made each year if a Drainage Utility and revenues are in place and sufficient Drainage funds are available. No prepayment penalty will be assessed; and now therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLACK DIAMOND, KING COUNTY, WASHINGTON, ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> The sum of One Hundred Thousand and 00/100 Dollars is hereby transferred from the Sewer Reserve Fund to the Drainage Fund as an interfund loan for the purpose of funding the costs of the Drainage and Stormwater Management Plans required to meet Federal and State mandates.

Section 2. The five year interfund loan shall be paid back to the Sewer Reserve Fund from the Drainage Fund in full by June 1, 2013. Interest shall accrue monthly at the

monthly State Pool Interest Rate on the declining balance from the date of transfer until the loan is fully paid. If a Drainage Utility is in place and sufficient revenue is available, the loan may be paid in five annual installments of \$20,000 each plus accrued interest, commencing June 1, 2009 and ending June 1, 2013, at which time all remaining principal and interest on the loan shall be due. No prepayment penalty shall be assessed.

Section 3. Each and every provision of this Ordinance shall be deemed severable. In the event that any portion of this Ordinance is determined by final order of a court of competent jurisdiction to be void or unenforceable, such determination shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions thereof provided the intent of this Ordinance can still be furthered without the invalid provision.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect five (5) days after publication as required by law. A summary of this Ordinance may be published in lieu of the entire Ordinance, as authorized by State law.

SUMMARY STATEMENT:

In 1972 Council authorized the issuance of \$147,000 of 1973 Water Revenue Bonds from the US Department of Agriculture, Farmers Home Administration at 5% interest, a great rate at that time. The bonds were payable over thirty eight years.

In the original Bond Ordinance authorized by Ordinance 149, Council reserved the right to call for redemption prior to the stated maturity date with out penalty, any time after 1985. A register notice is required to be given 30 days prior to any call of bonds.

Revenue Bonds in their nature require a higher revenue coverage, separate reserves and essentially-higher rates; therefore, it is in the Water Funds best interest to payoff the balance of the 1973 Water Revenue Bonds. The payment will require \$32,000 for the principal plus interest of approximately \$1,070 with an assumed August 2008 payoff date. A savings of approximately \$3,080 in interest costs will be achieved with this early payoff. The Water Reserve Fund has sufficient funds for the payoff.

1. <u>Items and Services to be Provided by Vendor.</u>

- 1.1 Vendor shall provide the items and services set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto, in accordance with the specifications set forth in Exhibit B attached hereto.
- 1.2 Vendor shall be responsible for delivery, installation and initial adjustment of all items purchased under this Agreement.
- 2. <u>Schedule.</u> All items shall be delivered within four weeks of the date of this Agreement, unless a later delivery date is agreed to by the City in writing.
- 3. <u>Purchase Price.</u> The purchase price for all items and services provided under this Agreement shall be a lump sum of \$70,046.06 plus sales tax of \$6,023.96, for a total of \$76,070.02.
- 4. <u>Standard Terms and Conditions.</u> This Agreement includes the standard terms and conditions attached hereto as Exhibit C.

5. Payment.

5.1 Payment will be made by City warrant within thirty (30) days of receipt of a correct invoice for items that have been delivered and installed in accordance with the terms of this Agreement

- 5.2 Vendor shall keep cost records and accounts pertaining to this Agreement available for inspection by City representatives for three (3) years after final payment unless a longer period is required by a third-party agreement. Vendor shall make copies available to the City on request.
- 5.3 If the items provided or services rendered do not meet the requirements of the Agreement, Vendor will correct or modify the items or work to comply with the Agreement. The City may withhold payment for such items or work until the items or work meets the requirements of the Agreement.
- 6. <u>Storage.</u> Vendor agrees to stage and store items for up to 60 days with no storage charges to the City.
- 7. Purchase of Additional Items. The City may purchase additional items at the unit prices set forth in Exhibit A for a period of one year from the date of this Agreement, on the same terms and conditions as this Agreement, except Vendor reserves the right to pass on to the City any addition fuel surcharges on additional furniture assessed by the manufacturer. Vendor shall provide written documentation from the manufacturer within ten days of notification to Vendor.

8. <u>Discrimination and Compliance with Laws.</u>

- 8.1 Vendor agrees not to discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment or any other person in the performance of this Agreement because of race, creed, color, national origin, marital status, sex, age, disability, or other circumstance prohibited by federal, state, or local law or ordinance, except for a bona fide occupational qualification.
- 8.2 Vendor shall comply with all federal, state, and local laws and ordinances applicable to the work to be done under this Agreement.
- 8.3 Any violation of this Section 8 shall be a material breach of this Agreement and grounds for immediate cancellation, termination, or suspension of the Agreement by the City, in whole or in part, and may result in Vendor's ineligibility to conduct further work for the City.
- 9. <u>Indemnification/Hold Harmless</u>. The Vendor shall defend, indemnify and hold the City, its officers, officials, employees and volunteers harmless from any and all claims, injuries, damages, losses or suits including attorney fees, arising out of or in connection with Vendor's performance of this Agreement, except for injuries and damages caused by the sole negligence of the City.
- 10. <u>Insurance.</u> The Vendor shall procure and maintain for the duration of the Agreement, insurance against claims for injuries to persons or damage to property which may arise from or in

connection with items and materials supplied to the City and work performed by Vendor under this Agreement.

10.1 Minimum Scope of Insurance. Vendor shall obtain insurance of the type described below:

Commercial General Liability insurance shall be written on Insurance Services Office (ISO) occurrence form CG 00 01 and shall cover products liability. The City shall be named as an insured under the Vendor's Commercial General Liability insurance policy using ISO Additional Insured-Vendors Endorsement CG 20 15 or a substitute endorsement providing equivalent coverage.

10.2 Minimum Amounts of Insurance. Vendor shall maintain the following insurance limits:

<u>Commercial General Liability</u> insurance shall be written with limits no less than \$1,000,000 each occurrence, \$1,000,000 general aggregate and a \$2,000,000 products liability aggregate limit.

10.3 Other Insurance Provisions. The insurance policies are to contain, or be endorsed to contain, the following provisions for Commercial General Liability insurance:

The Vendor's insurance coverage shall be primary insurance as respect the City. Any Insurance, self-insurance, or insurance pool coverage maintained by the City shall be excess of the Vendor's insurance and shall not contribute with it.

The Vendor's insurance shall be endorsed to state that coverage shall not be cancelled by either party, except after thirty (30) days prior written notice by certified mail, return receipt requested, has been given to the City.

- 10.4 Acceptability of Insurers. Insurance is to be placed with insurers with a current A.M. Best rating of not less than A:VII.
- 10.5 Verification of Coverage. Vendor shall furnish the City with original certificates and a copy of the amendatory endorsements, including but not necessarily limited to the additional insured endorsement, evidencing the insurance requirements of the Vendor before goods, materials or supplies will be accepted by the City.
- 11. <u>Assigning or Subcontracting</u>. Vendor shall not assign, transfer, subcontract, or encumber any rights, duties, or interests accruing from this Agreement without the express prior written consent of the City, which consent may be withheld at the sole discretion of the City.
- 12. <u>Disputes</u>. Any action for claims arising out of or relating to this Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Washington. Venue shall be in King County Superior Court, Kent, Washington.

- 13. <u>Attorney Fees</u>. In any suit or action instituted to enforce any right granted in this Agreement, the substantially prevailing party shall be entitled to recover its costs, disbursements, and reasonable attorney fees from the other party.
- 14. Extent of Agreement/Modification. This Agreement, together with any attachments or addenda, represents the entire and integrated Agreement between the parties hereto and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations, or agreements, either written or oral. This Agreement may only be amended, modified, or added to by written instrument properly signed by both parties.

THE PURCHASE ORDER INCLUDES THE FOLLOWING TERMS AND CONDITIONS AND INCLUDES, BUT IS NOT LIMITED TO THE INVITATION TO BID, REQUEST FOR QUOTATIONS, SPECIFICATIONS, PLANS, AND PUBLISHED RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE CITY OF BLACK DIAMOND AND THE POLICIES AND ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF BLACK DIAMND AND THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON, WHICH ARE HEREBY INCORPORATED BY REFERENCE.

- 1. CHANGES No alteration in any of the terms, conditions, delivery price, quality, quantities, or specification of this order will be effective without written consent of the City.
- 2. HANDLING No charges will be allowed for handling, including but not limited to packing, wrapping bags, containers or reels, unless otherwise stated herein.
- 3. DELIVERY For any exception to the delivery date as specified on this order, vendor shall give prior notification and obtain written approval thereto from the City with respect to delivery under this order. Time is of the essence and the order is subject to termination for failure to deliver as specified and/or appropriate damages. The acceptance by the Purchaser of late performance with or without objection or reservation shall not waive the right to claim damage for such breach nor constitute a waiver of the requirements for the timely performance of any obligation remaining to be performed by Vendor.

SUMMARY STATEMENT:

Currently the City has a need for additional engineering services associated with the Mayor's request for city staff to review the remodeling of the council chambers and the old court offices. After review by the City's building official it was determined that if we use the old court offices an additional fire exit from the building in the west wall will need to be provided.

The City of Black Diamond has retained the services of PacWest Engineering for various high-level engineering services, including the update of its water system comprehensive plan, water rate and impact fee study, sewer rate and impact fee study, development standards and a transportation planning study. The firm has provided services to the City since June 2007 and was designated City Engineer in March 2008.

This item would approve PacWest Engineering's scope to look into the structure of the building to see if we will be able to cut a hole in the wall and provide us with the necessary structural requirements.

The cost associated with structural analysis is not to exceed \$2,000.

ORDINANCE NO. 08-864

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLACK DIAMOND, WASHINGTON, TO ALLOW FOR ANIMAL WELFARE AGENCIES RECOGNIZED BY THE HUMANE SOCIETY FOR SEATTLE-KING COUNTY TO TRAP ANIMALS AND AMENDING 6.08.140 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE

WHEREAS, the City of Black Diamond has previously adopted King County ordinances related to animal control fees and penalties; licensing of dogs and cats; kennels, pet shops, grooming parlors and similar services as codified in Chapter 6.08 of the Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, in 1988 the City of Black Diamond City Council adopted Ordinance 383, thus creating additional animal control regulations to include provisions related to animal trapping; and

WHEREAS, Section 6.08.140 of the Black Diamond Municipal Code now reads:

Animal traps—Prohibited—Exception

It is unlawful for anyone to use traps to apprehend any animal inside the city, unless by animal control or law enforcement officers for the purposes of apprehending a dangerous or diseased animal or unless such trap is approved by a city engineer of the city for the apprehension of a dangerous or diseased animal. This section does not apply to mouse traps, mole traps, or rat traps; and

WHEREAS, South County Cats is a non-profit organization recognized by the Humane Society for Seattle-King County that focuses on the trap-neuter-return, spaying/neutering and relocation of feral cats; now therefore

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLACK DIAMOND, KING COUNTY, WASHINGTON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u>. There is hereby added a new Section 6.08.140 to the Black Diamond Municipal Code and it shall be entitled **Animal traps—Prohibited—Exception**.

Section 2. There is hereby added a new section 6.08.140 which shall read as follows:

It is unlawful for anyone to use traps to apprehend any animal inside the city, unless by animal control or law enforcement officers for the purposes of apprehending a dangerous or diseased animal, or by representatives from an animal welfare agency recognized by the Humane Society

for Seattle-King County, for the purpose of trap/neuter/return or an adoption program. This section does not apply to mouse traps, mole traps, or rat traps.

Section 3. Each and every provision of this Ordinance shall be deemed severable. In the event that any portion of this Ordinance is determined by final order of a court of competent jurisdiction to be void or unenforceable, such determination shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions thereof provided the intent of this Ordinance can still be furthered without the invalid provision.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect five (5) days after publication as required by law. A summary of the Ordinance may be published in lieu of the entire Ordinance, as authorized by State law.
