SUMMARY STATEMENT:

The use of Phosphorous-based fertilizers has been linked to the reduction of water quality within waterbodies through-out the country and the state of Washington. This ordinance will take steps in limiting the use of Phosphorous-based fertilizers on turf in Black Diamond and will promote education in alleviating the impacts associated with their use.

COMMITTEE REVIEW AND RECOMMENDATION: Parks and Cemetery Committee reviewed.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: MOTION to adopt Ordinance No. 10-937, limiting the use of phosphorous based fertilizers on lawns throughout Black Diamond in order to preserve and protect water quality within water bodies throughout the City.

ORDINANCE NO. 10-937

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLACK DIAMOND, KING COUNTY, WASHINGTON, LIMITING THE USE OF PHOSPHOROUS BASED FERTILIZERS ON LAWNS THROUGHOUT BLACK DIAMOND IN ORDER TO PRESERVE AND PROTECT WATER QUALITY WITHIN WATER BODIES THROUGHOUT THE CITY.

WHEREAS, research on lake water quality cites the contribution of excessive phosphorous loading to the degradation of lake waters through stimulation of algae and weed growth, leading to oxygen depletion resulting from the decomposition of plants; and that such processes can play a role in potential eutrophication of water bodies; and

WHEREAS, runoff resulting from the use of phosphorous based fertilizers on lawns is a primary source of phosphorous pollution in area waters; and

WHEREAS, turf fertilizers containing no or very low amounts of phosphorous are available; and

WHEREAS, there is a body of experience in other jurisdictions regarding limitations on the use of fertilizers containing phosphorous, which demonstrates that use limitations can be successfully managed without substantially impacting user needs; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the council of the City of Black Diamond to limit the use of fertilizers on lawns containing the plant nutrient phosphorous;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLACK DIAMOND, WASHINGTON, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u>. A new chapter 14.06 entitled "Use of Phosphorous Based Fertilizers on Lawns," is hereby added to the Black Diamond Municipal Code and it shall read as show in the copy attached to this ordinance as Exhibit A and hereby incorporated by reference, with each page of the exhibit being initialed and dated by the Mayor.

<u>Section 2.</u> <u>Severability.</u> Each and every provision of this Ordinance shall be deemed severable. In the event that any portion of this Ordinance is determined by final order of a court of competent jurisdiction to be void or unenforceable, such determination shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions thereof, provided the intent of this Ordinance can still be furthered without the invalid provision.

14.06.05 Definitions

The definitions in this section apply throughout this chapter unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

14.06.06	City – The City of Black Diamond, WA.
14.06.07	Fertilizer – Any substance containing one or more recognized plant nutrients
	and that is either used for its plant nutrient content or is designated for use or
	claimed to have value in promoting plant growth, or both. "Fertilizer" includes
	gypsum and manipulated animal and vegetable manures. "Fertilizer" does not
	include:

- 1. Unmanipulated animal and vegetable manures and other products exempted by the department by rule;
- 2. Calcium carbonate (lime) and anhydrous ammonia; and
- 3. Materials including, but not limited to, compost biosolids or slow release fertilizer used in compliance with best management practices.

14.06.08	Impervious Surface - A highway, street, sidewalk, parking lot, driveway or
	other artificial surface that prevents infiltration of water into the soil.
14.06.09	Turf - Noncrop land planted in closely mowed, managed grasses on
	residential property. Turf does not include managed pasture, hayfield, hay turf
	grown on turf farms, home or commercial vegetable production, horticultural
	beds, flower beds, general landscaping or any other form of agricultural
	production.

14.06.10 Applying Phosphorous Based Fertilizers to Turf Prohibited

- A. Except as provided in subsection B of this section, a person may not apply to turf a fertilizer containing the plant nutrient phosphorous.
- B. Subsection A. of this section does not apply when:
 - Soil tests or other certification by a turf specialist performed within three years prior to the application indicates that the level of available phosphorous in the soil is insufficient to support healthy turf growth, and the application rate is consistent with best practice standards; or
 - ii. The property owner or an agent of the property is first establishing turf via seed or sod procedures and the application is made only during the first calendar year following the first seeding or sod installation; or
 - Applying turf fertilizer for agricultural or horticultural uses.

14.06.15 Applying Phosphorous Based Fertilizers to Impervious Services Prohibited

A person may not apply a fertilizer to an impervious surface. Fertilizer released on an impervious surface must be immediately contained and either legally applied to turf or another legal site or returned to the original container or another appropriate container.

14.06.20 **Education**

The City shall seek to identify opportunities for grant funding and partnerships to support a consumer education and outreach effort, making use of existing outreach materials produced by other entities to the extent possible.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLACK DIAMOND, KING COUNTY, WASHINGTON, AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE THE SECOND MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING TO THE COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF BLACK DIAMOND AND BLACK DIAMOND POLICE OFFICERS ASSOCIATION

WHEREAS, the Black Diamond Police Officers Association (the "Association") is the authorized bargaining representative for the Black Diamond Police Officers; and

WHEREAS, the Association was formed in 2008; and

WHEREAS, the City and the Association entered into a new six (6) year Collective Bargaining Agreement ("CBA") effective August 31, 2008 through August 30, 2014; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 15.1 of the CBA, the Association members have agreed to add vision and orthodontia insurance coverage and pay costs of such coverage; and

WHEREAS, it is mutually understood and agreed by and between the parties that all Association members will participate in the following Vision Service Plan-Full Family, \$25 deductible and Orthodontia-Plan V offered by Association on Washington Cities at such costs as established by the insurer;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLACK DIAMOND, WASHINGTON, DOES RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> The City Council hereby authorizes the Mayor to execute the Second Memorandum of Understanding to the Collective Bargaining Agreement substantially in the form attached hereto as Exhibit A.

SECOND MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANING CITY OF BLACK DIAMOND AND

BLACK DIAMOND POLICE OFFICERS' ASSOICATION

- 1. <u>Date of Parties.</u> This Second Memorandum of Understanding (MOU-2) is effective upon execution by the City of Black Diamond (City) and the Black Diamond Police Officers' Association (Association).
- 2. Background and Purpose.
 - 2.1 The Parties have executed a Collective Bargaining Agreement for the period from August 31, 2008 to August 30, 2014 (CBA)
 - 2.2 In accordance with Section 15.1 of the CBA, the Association members have agreed to add vision and orthodontia coverage.
- 3. Additional Agreed Coverage
 - 3.1. It is mutually understood and agreed by and between the parties that all Association members will participate in the following plans offered by Association of Washington Cities at such costs as established by the insurer:

Vision Service Plan – Full Family, \$25 deductible Orthodontia – Plan V

These additional coverages shall be the employees' sole expense and cost.

4. <u>Confirmation of Agreement Terms.</u> All other terms and conditions of the Agreement shall remain unchanged and in full force and effect.
