# BLACK DIAMOND CITY COUNCIL MINUTES October 28, 2011 Special Meeting

### **CALL TO ORDER, FLAG SALUTE:**

Mayor Olness called the special meeting back to order at 2:03 p.m. and lead us all in the Flag Salute.

# APPEARANCE OF FAIRNESS INQUIRIES:
