BLACK DIAMOND CITY COUNCIL MINUTES February 21, 2013

Council Chamber, 25510 Lawson Street, Black Diamond, Washington

CALL TO ORDER, FLAG SALUTE:

Mayor Olness called the regular meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and lead us all in the Flag Salute.

ROLL CALL:

PRESENT: Councilmembers Deady, Goodwin and Taylor.

ABSENT: Councilmember Benson (excused).

Staff present were: Andrew Williamson, Executive Director of Engineering Services/Ec. Dev.; Greg Smith, Fire Chief; Jamey Kiblinger, Police Chief; Chris Bacha, City Attorney; Mark Hoppen, City Administrator and Brenda L. Martinez, Asst. City Admin/City Clerk.

Mayor Olness asked Council if it was okay to take the Fire presentation first on the agenda tonight. There was Council consensus to allow this.

Fire Department – Chief Smith gave a presentation on "Having an Exit Strategy". He discussed with Council a tragedy that occurred in Rhode Island at the Station Nightclub which was the fourth deadliest nightclub fire in U.S. history, killing 100 people. In addition to the 100 fatalities, some 230 people were injured. He further discussed the problems that stopped people from exiting the building. He noted the importance of folks having an exit strategy when entering a building and a room. He shared history on past Chicago fires.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Resolution No. 13-853, authorizing the Mayor to execute an Interlocal Agreement to provide Law Enforcement Mutual Aid and Mobilization between the WA State Patrol, King County Sheriff, Port of Seattle and the Cities of Bellevue, Black Diamond, Bothell, Issaquah, Kirkland, Mercer Island and Redmond in the event of a Law Enforcement involved Fatal or serious injury incident

Chief Kiblinger distributed to Council a handout she prepared regarding why the department should participate in this ILA. Areas she highlighted were: 1) why KCIRT, 2) benefits, and 3) can we afford it.

A motion was made by Councilmember Deady and seconded by Councilmember Taylor to adopt Resolution No. 13-853, authorizing the Mayor to execute an Interlocal Agreement to provide Law Enforcement Mutual Aid and Mobilization between the WA State Patrol, King County Sheriff, Port of Seattle and the Cities of Bellevue, Black Diamond, Bothell, Issaquah, Kirkland, Mercer Island and Redmond in the event of a Law Enforcement involved Fatal or serious injury incident. Motion passed (4-0, proxy vote Benson).

NEW BUSINESS:

Resolution No. 13-856, declaring certain City property surplus

Executive Director of Engineering Services/Ec. Dev. Mr. Williamson reported periodically throughout the year the City disposes of City property no longer needed or in use by city staff. Items that have value will be sold at auction. Items that do not sell will be donated to charity, recycled or destroyed. This resolution declares the equipment surplus to the needs of the city.

A motion was made by Councilmember Goodwin and seconded by Councilmember Deady to adopt Resolution No. 13-856, declaring certain City property surplus. Motion passed (4-0, proxy vote Benson).

Ordinance No. 13-998, amending Section 13.16.010 of the Black Diamond Municipal Code regarding the General Sewer Plan

Executive Director of Engineering Services/Ec. Dev. Mr. Williamson reported before Council is the General Sewer Plan for adoption. He added Council held a public hearing on November 15, 2012 and the comments were addressed. He also distributed letters from Department of Ecology and King County approving the proposed plan.

A motion was made by Councilmember Taylor and seconded by Councilmember Goodwin to postpone Ordinance No. 13-998, amending Section 13.16.010 of the Black Diamond Municipal Code regarding the General Sewer Plan. Motion passed (4-0, proxy vote Benson).

Ordinance No. 13-999, revisions to Black Diamond Cemetery Code, Section 12.12 are needed, as state law has been revised since adoption in 1978 and an untapped resource in providing funding and future maintenance is potentially available

A motion was made by Councilmember Goodwin and seconded by Councilmember Deady to postpone Ordinance No. 13-999, until the March 7 Council meeting. Motion passed (4-0, proxy vote Benson).

DEPARTMENT REPORTS:

Community Development – Executive Director of Engineering Services/Ec. Dev. Mr. Williamson reported on recharging occupancy space which goes along with what the Fire Department suggests and recommends for occupancy and assembly space.

Jay Rodne, Rep. Chad Magendanz, Sen. Joe Fain, Rep. Mark Hargrove and Rep. Pat Sullivan. We each presented our top project (ours was the intersection of SR 169 & Roberts Drive).
