CALL TO ORDER, FLAG SALUTE:

Mayor Olness called the regular meeting to order at 7:01 p.m. and lead us all in the Flag Salute.

APPOINTMENTS, PRESENTATIONS, ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Two Proclamations:

National Recovery Month Proclamation-

WHEREAS, behavioral health is an essential part of health and one's overall wellness; and WHEREAS, prevention of mental and/or substance use disorders works, treatment is effective, and people recover in our area and around the nation; and

WHEREAS, preventing and overcoming mental and/or substance use disorders is essential to achieving healthy lifestyle, both physically and emotionally; and

WHEREAS, we must encourage relatives and friends of people with mental and/or substance use disorders to implement preventive measures, recognize the signs of a problem and guide those in need to appropriate treatment and recovery support services; and

WHEREAS, in 2011, 2.3 million people aged 12 or older received specialty treatment for a substance use disorder and more than 31.6 million adults aged 18 or older received services

for mental health problems, according to the 2011 National Survey on Drug Use and Health. Given the serious nature of this public health problem, we must continue to reach the millions more who need help; and

WHEREAS, on October 1, 2013 as a result of the Affordable Care Act, more than 11 million uninsured individuals with behavioral health needs will become eligible for affordable insurance coverage for their treatment needs, according to the 2011 National Survey on Drug Use and Health; and

WHEREAS, to help more people achieve long-term recovery, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA), the White House Office of National Drug Control Policy (ONDCP), and local human service agencies invite all residents of Black Diamond, Washington to participate in National Recovery Month.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rebecca Olness, Mayor of the City of Black Diamond, on behalf of the Black Diamond City Council, call upon Black Diamond residents to observe the month of September with appropriate programs, activities, and ceremonies supporting this year's Recovery Month and do hereby proclaim in the City of Black Diamond, the month of September 2013 as a month to recognize

WHEREAS, all citizens of Black Diamond are encouraged to participate in the *Ready* campaign and become more prepared;

Resolution No. 13-889, reauthorizing investment of the City of Black Diamond's monies in the Local Government Investment Pool (LGIP)

Finance Director Miller reported before Council tonight is a resolution re-authorizing the City to invest in the State's Investment Pool. She noted the City gets a better return on their money as well as being the investment pool being very safe.

Community Development Director Welsh reported that last December Council authorized changes to the City's Comprehensive Plan and with those changes the City now needs to bring in line City Code. She noted the Planning Commission did have a public hearing and no testimony was heard and they recommended that Council make this change to the residential cluster code.

Executive Director of Engineering Services/Ec. Dev. Williamson reported this on-call task is to set the topical survey for the Springs Project (Task 3) and the partners responsible for the dollars for the work are Palmer Coking Coal and YarrowBay.

A motion was made by Councilmember Deady and seconded by Councilmember Taylor to adopt Resolution No. 13-885, authorizing an on-call task request with Parametrix for survey work at the Black Diamond Springs. Motion passed (5-0).

Resolution No. 13-886, authorizing the Mayor to execute a Professional Services Agreement with RH2 Engineering, Inc. for the Black Diamond Springs preliminary alternatives analysis

Executive Director of Engineering Services/Ec. Dev. Williamson noted this is the Civil Engineering service for the Springs Project.

A motion was made by Councilmember Taylor and seconded by Councilmember Benson to adopt Resolution No. 13-886, authorizing the Mayor to execute a Professional Services

Agreement with RH2 Engineering, Inc. for the Black Diamond Springs preliminary alternatives analysis. Motion **passed** (5-0).
