BLACK DIAMOND CITY COUNCIL MINUTES October 17, 2013

CALL TO ORDER, FLAG SALUTE:

Mayor Olness called the regular meeting to order at 7:01 p.m. and lead us all in the Flag Salute.

ROLL CALL:

PRESENT: Councilmembers Deady, Goodwin, Edelman, Benson and Taylor.

ABSENT: None.

Staff present: Andrew Williamson, Executive Director of Engineering Services/Ec. Dev.; Greg Goral, Police Commander; Greg Smith, Fire Chief; Jamey Kiblinger, Police Chief; Mark Hoppen, City Administrator; Chris Bacha, City Attorney and Brenda L. Martinez, City Clerk.

A **motion** was made by Councilmember Edelman and **seconded** by Councilmember Deady to change the order of the agenda and move the presentations first on the agenda and to add another presentation. Motion **passed** (5-0).

PRESENTATIONS:

Legislative Issue and Update from Olympia – Representative Rodne and Magendanz

Representative Magendanz updated Council on legislative items for this year and the budget that was passed and what it means. He noted it being passed 86 to 11 and this was a record as this usually does not happen. He discussed not getting a transportation package adopted and noted it didn't go through because they wanted to do a bipartisan package and they wanted the time to discuss on items that are dear to the voters along with the need to build public trust. He discussed the three areas they are focusing on for transportation. He also noted doing a one-day session regarding transportation on a bipartisan package.

Bras for the Cause – Donna Elzenga

Ms. Elzenga noted all fundraising go to folks who are underinsured and no insurance. The event is where folks decorate bras; the event will be October 24th at St. Elizabeth Hospital. There is a website where folks can donate and she invited everyone to attend the event.

NEW BUSINESS:

Resolution No. 13-894, authorizing a contract with Parametrix for On-Call Transportation Engineering Services

Executive Director of Engineering Services/Ec. Dev. Williamson reported this is a renewal of the transportation contract for the City. This contract has been looked at by the Public Works Committee and noted Parametrix has served the City well and the funding comes from all different sources.

A motion was made by Councilmember Goodwin and seconded by Councilmember Taylor to adopt Resolution No. 13-894, authorizing a contract with Parametrix for On-Call Transportation Engineering Services. Motion passed (5-0).

Resolution No. 13-895, authorizing the Sixth Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Black Diamond Police Officers Association regarding the Training of Reserve Police Officers

Chief Kiblinger reported this is the sixth MOU with the Association and it calls for no increase for officers while field training and this would be through the end of the contract. She discussed the reserves program and noted they are commissioned Police Officers and go through an Academy and cannot go outside of the city limits. The Academy is State approved and will be the same hiring process as with any full time Police Officer. If they pass the screening they then go to the Academy and then through field training just like a regular officer with the department.

A motion was made by Councilmember Deady and seconded by Councilmember Taylor to adopt Resolution No. 13-895, authorizing the Sixth Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Black Diamond Police Officers Association regarding the Training of Reserve Police Officers. Motion passed (5-0).

A motion was made by Councilmember Benson and seconded by Councilmember Edelman to add to the agenda the discussion of the Perry Puppe Stormwater charges. Motion passed (5-0).

City Attorney Bacha responded that the City has an obligation to collect on all bills even if they were not billed and there was an error. He noted there is an opinion on file and would be happy to provide this again, right now the City has no written policies on forgiveness and this is something we could look at. He suggested drafting rules the Council can look at and decide if they would like to pass them. He also discussed outsourcing this process with a company to provide the billing process for the City.

Councilmember Taylor reported the Ad Hoc Committee work is continuing to move forward and satisfied and pleased with getting a good framework done and the LOS they will be using as a benchmark and how to apply that to the models. Once this is a little more put together they will schedule a workstudy with Council.

ATTORNEY REPORT:

City Attorney Bacha discussed a topic of council meetings and movement on the First Amendment and what can occur at Council meetings; trend in the Courts for further restricting how local governments can control their meetings. The 9th circuit feels folks can speak critically of elected officials and we may need to revisit the Council rules regarding this.

PUBLIC COMMENTS:

Kristine Hanson, Black Diamond commented on the timing for shut off notices and the 10:00 a.m. deadline and would like to see this extended to maybe 3:00 p.m. or 4:00 p.m. and would like to see the Public Works Committee look into this.
