Black Diamond is my home. I love living here and want to want to contribute to the prosperity of the city while maintaining the rural character and recreational opportunities that brought our family here. I have been attending council meetings and other public meetings for many years. I feel that I have experience that will benefit the city.

2. What strength would you bring to the Council.

I am a highly motivated individual. I enjoy challenges, and do the necessary research to get up to speed, and actively participate, including asking questions as necessary. As a retired person, I have time to devote to the position. I have had to create budgets and had to negotiate contracts with the Federal government. I will use common sense in my decision making and make informed decisions that I feel will benefit the city and be in the best interest of our citizens.

- 3. What are the three highest priorities and/or issues you believe the City needs to address. How would you propose to address these issues?
- A. Our city's highest priority has to be public safety. We have seen a rise in burglaries over the past few months. We must maintain our level of service in our police department and our citizens must feel safe in their homes. We are looking at reduced service of our fire department. There is a promise of a new firehouse but no way to pay for staffing. In today's tight budgeting we must be forward thinking. Our citizens deserve the highest level of service we can afford. But decisions need to be based on facts, not promises or what ifs. We need to look at staffing in other jurisdictions. Are we equivalent? If not, why not and what can we do to better our service.
- B. The fiscal health of the City is vital to maintain the proper level of services as we grow. I believe that development should pay for development. The costs should not be borne by the current citizens. We need to proceed carefully and thoughtfully. We should not burden the city with unnecessary risk. We need to ensure that the citizens of our city are not additionally burdened with a tax bill that should be borne by the developer and future residents.
- C. We must protect our lakes, and streams as well as the rest of our environment. We must ensure that adequate provisions are made for school and road/highway improvements and the control of traffic as our city grows.
- 4. Explain your current and past community involvement and/or service on city, nonprofit, or public boards, committees, task forces, or commissions and how this has contributed to the Black Diamond community. Address its relevance to the position of Black Diamond City Councilmember.

I currently volunteer as a server at the Black Diamond Community Center. I also have supported the recent fund raising activities at the Community Center. I spent many years with the Lake Sawyer Community Club, serving on the board of directors and as secretary. I also coordinated

the 4th of July activities which included fundraising for the fireworks display for many years. I attend St. Barbara Church and act as a Eucharistic Minister. In 2008, I took the initiative to form a Block Watch committee and serve as the Block Watch Captain.

I have attended city council meetings for many years beginning back when I was a board member of LSCC in the 1990s. I have attended the informational meetings hosted by Yarrow Bay prior to approval of the MPDs. I have been actively involved in the MPD and Development Agreements hearings. I have attended Council work studies, Planning Commission meetings, and Town Hall meetings.

This has given me insight into how the Council functions and interacts with City Staff. I also have an understanding of how the public feels about the direction our city is taking.

1. Why are you interested in serving as a Black Diamond City Councilmember? During the past few years I have attended many meetings of the Black Diamond Planning Commission and City Council, as well as town hall meetings and public hearings. Attending these meetings has created within me a desire to become more directly involved in my city. I believe I can make valuable contributions to planning both present and the future of Black Diamond.

2. What strength would you bring to the Council?

More than 25 years experience in personnel management, project management and customer service training.

3. What are the three highest priorities and/or issues you believe the City needs to address? How would you propose to address these issues?

I believe the three highest priorities to be:

- Moving forward in a methodical manner towards the completion of the MPDs proposed by Yarrow Bay Holdings. The City Council should remain open to public opinion, assure the requirements included in the MPDs are met and the members of the City Council should be united in their focus on the brightest possible future for Black Diamond and its citizens.
- Assurances that emergency services provided in our city are sufficient in meeting the current and future needs of the citizens. Within the past month I personally suffered a health issue that required a 911 call. At the time of this call I was attending a gathering at a facility located within the Black Diamond city limits. Seven minutes passed from the time the 911 call was placed until paramedics arrived on the scene. Five minute response time is a mantra for those who make a living putting out fires and responding to heart attacks. Having firefighters and equipment on the scene of a fire or medical emergency within five minutes is essential for two reasons:
 - 1. the chance of surviving a heart attack or major trauma starts dropping off rapidly after five minutes.
 - 2. "Flash over" when fires literally erupt occur within five minutes of the first visible flame.

- The creation of ideas and planning to attract people to visit and live in Black Diamond. During the time the Kummer Bridge was closed many businesses in our city suffered a significant drop in commerce.
