SUMMARY STATEMENT: The state legislature by new legislation this summer made provisions for cities to take over Transportation Benefit Districts that they have formed if the district boundaries are the same as the City boundaries. This action will significantly reduce administrative costs by 1) eliminating the cost of maintaining completely separate records, meetings, notifications, hearings, and accounting 2) eliminates the cost of passing money back and forth from the City and the Transportation Benefit District. With this action the City will be able to use the license tab revenue directly for the purposes as established by the Transportation Benefit District as long as the terms and conditions of the state law authorizing the use of the funds are met. FISCAL NOTE (Finance Department): The Finance Department will be setting up a separate fund to ensure that license tab revenue is tracked separately so that all necessary reporting and conditions of state law will be met.

ORDINANCE NO. 15-1059

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLACK DIAMOND, WASHINGTON, ASSUMING THE RIGHTS, POWERS, FUNCTIONS AND OBLIGATIONS OF THE BLACK DIAMOND TRANSPORTATION BENEFIT DISTRICT, AS ALLOWED BY SSB 5987.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Black Diamond has adopted Ordinance No. 1057 creating the Black Diamond Transportation Benefit District with the same boundaries as the City limits;

WHEREAS, Second Engrossed Substitute Senate Bill 5987, in Section 302, which took effect on July 15, 2015, provides that "the assumption of the rights, powers, functions and obligations of a transportation benefit district may be initiated by the adoption of an ordinance or resolution by the city or county legislative authority indicating its intention to conduct a hearing concerning the assumption of such rights, powers, functions and obligations"; and

WHEREAS, the City of Black Diamond held a public hearing on the proposed assumption of the rights, powers, functions and obligations of the Black Diamond Transportation Benefit District on October 1st, 2015 at the Council Chambers 25510 Lawson Street; and

WHEREAS, after the public hearing, the City Council voted to assume the rights, powers, functions and obligations of the Black Diamond Transportation Benefit District; Now, Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLACK DIAMOND AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> <u>Findings.</u> The City Council makes the following findings to support the actions described herein:

A. BACKGROUND

- 1. The 2015 legislature included in its transportation funding bill 2nd Engrossed Substitute Senate Bill 5987 the authority to take over and assume the rights, powers, functions and obligations of the Black Diamond Transportation Benefit District
- 2. This action will significantly simplify the administration and of the funds collected for streets for greater efficiency of government.
- 3. The Black Diamond Transportation Benefit District has not yet collected any funds, does not have any contracts, has not committed to any projects and has not spent any funds, which simplifies the transfer of authority.

4. The Black Diamond Transportation Benefit District as yet does not have any assets, simplifying the transfer of authority.

Section 2. Assumption of the Black Diamond Transportation Benefit District

The City hereby assumes all the rights, powers, functions and obligations of the Black Diamond Transportation Benefit District and by this action the Black Diamond Transportation Benefit District will cease to exist as a separate entity.

Section 3. <u>Severability</u>. If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance should be held to be unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of any other section, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance.

Section 4. <u>Publication and Effective Date</u>. This Ordinance shall be published by an approved summary consisting of the title. This ordinance shall be effective five days after publication, as provided by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 15-1060

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BLACK DIAMOND, WASHINGTON, RELATING TO COUNCIL MEETING **DATES** AND LOCATIONS: **AMENDING** MEETINGS OF THE BLACK DIAMOND MUNICIPAL CODE TO CHANGE THE TOWN HALL MEETING DAYS TO THE SECOND THURSDAY IN THE MONTHS OF **OCTOBER**; **PROVIDING** FOR MARCH AND SEVERABILITY; AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, the City Council currently meets on the second Thursday of January, March, May, July, September and November; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to schedule Town Hall meetings bi-annually and to meet on the second Thursday of March and October; Now, therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLACK DIAMOND DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1. Amending BDMC 2.04.010 (Meetings)</u>. Section 2.04.010 of the Black Diamond Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

The regular meetings of the city council of the city shall be held at the Black Diamond Municipal Building, 25510 Lawson Street, Black Diamond, King County, Washington, on the first and third Thursdays of each month at the hour of seven p.m. A work session of the city council shall be held at the Black Diamond Municipal Building, 25510 Lawson Street, Black Diamond, King County, Washington, on the second Thursday of each month at the hour of six p.m. Town Hall meetings shall be held at the Black Diamond Municipal Building, 25510 Lawson Street, Black Diamond, King County, Washington on the second Thursday in the months of January, March May, July, September, and October November at the hour of seven p.m.

Section 2. Severability. Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance, or its application to any person or circumstance, be declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid for any reason, or should any portion of this Ordinance be pre-empted by state or federal law or regulation, such decision or pre-emption shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance or its application to other persons or circumstances.

<u>Section 3. Effective Date</u>. This Ordinance shall be published in the official newspaper of the City, and shall take effect and be in full force five (5) days after the date of publication.
