



In Process & Completed Projects
Last 6 Years

Black Diamond City Council Growth Management, Land Use, and Community Services Committee,

The Citizens' Technical Action Team (TAT) has completed its review of the proposed Black Diamond 6-Yr 2017-2022 Transportation Improvement Plan (TIP) to be the subject of a Public Hearing at this coming Thursday's Council Meeting.

Our general observation is that all the big-ticket items listed simply have moved to the right—no surprise here as Oakpointe (nee YarrowBay) was in relative stasis for a while until it found investors to allow them to better move forward.

Yes. No development yet, No Impact, No mitigation.

Comments we have made on previous TIPs (2012, 2013, & 2014) largely would apply here, e.g., attached is what we submitted for the 2014 TIP Public Hearing. The only big difference we can see in the current TIP is the omission of the Rock Creek Bridge (Is that because work has already started and, therefore, it is no longer part of the long-term plan???).

Yes. This project is funded and in progress. No further planning is necessary.

TAT has decided to not provide Oral Testimony at this year's TIP Public Hearing, nor submit any Written Comments, as there are no new significant comments we could put forth that we haven't already made repeatedly in several annual iterations of the 6-Yr TIP (e.g., we remain firm in that the Master Developer should be funding all its required mitigation without the help of State Grants--which all the people pay for through with their taxes. Yes, we understand the City is obligated to "make a good faith effort" in seeking grants to help defray the Master Developer's costs. However, "Good faith" means you try and, if you fail, so be it.)

It is in the City's best interest to partner and broker a long term capacity solution for our major Roberts Drive and Ravensdale intersections. The City has existing deficiencies (and therefore responsibilities) at these intersections. The City has a very good deal in the development agreement as we have to apply for grants but do not have to come up with the funds for our share of the existing deficiency.

If the MPD permit expires and the long term fix is not yet complete, the City will have to figure out how to fund the project. There is a current opportunity to leverage developer funds for the long term fix.

It is apparent that these comments are not related to what is best for handling traffic or for citizens of Black Diamond but rather just an anti Oakpointe perspective.

We do have a concern about transparency. The 6-Yr Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) is trailing the 6-yr TIP and is not expected to be released to the Public until early July. In the past we have testified and submitted Written Comments on both. In fact, the former (CIP) has informed us and the Public as to the breakout of Grant monies vs. other sources. Such a breakout is not available in the latter (TIP). Consequently, this year, we can only guess at the level of Grant monies contemplated based on past CIPs. For example, in the attached (TAT Written Comments from 2014), we stated the following and have no reason to believe anything has significantly changed:

A couple of points:

• The CIP up date is now on a 2 year schedule and the 6 yr TIP is annual. There is no requirement that one document be completed before the other. There isn't a

- requirement that they even be the same. Priorities change; planning documents change. There is not requirement that the City apply for a grant
- The 6 year TIP provides a project list and a general priority and identifies the basic project types in the category of Safety, Maintenance, Pedestrian and Capacity. We are following the basic format the WSDOT gives us. This process is not a budgeting and financing feasibility exercise.
- What "transparency" issue ?!? This is an open public process. Just more continued attacks on staff.

"...in looking at the proposed 2015-2020 Capital Improvement Plan (CIP)--dated May 23, 2014--42% (\$7.7358M / \$18.595) of needed funding for all projects is made up of Grants! Another element of risk is that nearly 64% (\$4.935M/\$7.7358M) of that Grant money is back-ended into the 2nd half of the 6-Yr '15-'20 CIP."

One key issue that keeps getting misunderstood is the difference between a capacity adding project and a maintenance project and how it relates to risk.

MAINTENANCE: If we over estimate (as we usually do) the amount of grants that we will receive, the City is not harmed. We want to pull in as much preservation grant funding and upgrade funding as possible. If we always guess short as to the amount of projects that we can get grants for, the City would be harmed as we limit our opportunity.

CAPACITY: In Black Diamond we have only shown grants for capacity adding projects where we have had existing deficiency. The small percentage of grant funding for our problem intersections is entirely realistic and probable. The developer is funding the overwhelming vast majority of the capacity adding project needed for the City.

Most other Cities have a much larger grant percentage of their capacity adding projects than Black Diamond. They typically do this to help keep their traffic impact fees reasonable. They do run the risk of not meeting concurrency requirements if they can't keep up with their Level of service. This is not a risk in Black Diamond. By the development agreement, the developer must plan for, design and construct the capacity adding projects as identified in the approval process.
