

# **2015 State Transportation Package**

- **16.2** Billion
- No funding for Hwy 169, Hwy 410 or Hwy 900
- Small grant for Hwy 516
- Large Pkg not likely until 2025
- Projects would not begin until after 2035 at the earliest
- Provisional projects adopted in the interim cannot jump the cue

# Regional Transportation Benefit District

#### Trust

- Addresses issues directly effecting members of those communities
- Public tends to trust the smaller more local units of government
- TBD has a built in sunset provision

#### Efficiency

- Increases the number of projects that can be pursued and reduces the project delivery time
- Lean pass through funding and prioritization mechanism


#### Capabilities

Increases total revenue available for projects

Makes regional concurrency possible

Can provide ROW acquisition to bonding





# Benefits of a Transportation Benefit District?

- Allows SE King County (areas outside of Sound Transit) to band together and pool our license tab revenue
- The goal is to leverage that with a State Grant and potential Federal Funding
- A TBD can issue bonds to start the project sooner (potentially 2021)
