2013 BUDGET PLANNING AND CALENDAR



All City departments, especially Finance, will be busy the next few months preparing the City's annual operating budget. The operating budget funds services associated with Public Safety, Public Works, Parks, Planning and Permitting and other municipal services.

The budget tells the City's financial story and sets spending targets for the programs and services that city residents receive. Like other communities, Black Diamond will continue to have a challenge preparing a balanced budget. The economic downturn continues to negatively impact revenues that the City receives.

During the last half of August and September, the Finance Department updates the 2013 revenue forecast for the General Fund and other funds using 2012 trends and forecast information provided by Municipal Research and Services Center and other

FALL STORMWATER TIPS

As summer creeps to an end, it means the chance for rain increases, which, of course, means more stormwater runoff and potential for stormwater pollution and other stormwater hazards. Here are a few reminders:

- ★ Don't store lawn clippings/yard waste near water bodies. Agents can leach out of the waste and into the water, causing environmental degradation.
- ★ Use minimal fertilizers (always follow directions on labels for use and disposal).
- ★ Check your vehicles for fluid leaks and get them repaired.
- ★ Keep gutters and catch basins by your house clear of leaves and debris. This will help minimize maintenance of the stormwater system as well minimize the potential for flooding due to a covered catch basin.

TOUGH MUDDER RACE EVENT COME TO BLACK DIAMOND

On September 29th & 30th the City of Black Diamond will be home to the first Tough Mudder race in the Northwest. This will be a two day event held on PCCC property that will bring several thousand people to Black Diamond during the weekend. Traffic control will be in effect at the entrance (31407 3rd Ave) and exit (Lake Sawyer Rd) to the property. Higher traffic flow and some delays are expected between 6 a.m.– 11 a.m. and 12 p.m. - 5 p.m. You may want to use alternate routes of travel through town. CLEANING SURFACE WATER & KEEPING PARKS SAFE FOR EVERYONE & EVERYTHING TO ENJOY

Residents of Black Diamond may have noticed recent Dog Waste Bag Stations and signs going up asking users of our facilities to pick up after their dogs and requiring that pet owners restrain their animals in accordance with Black Diamond Municipal Code section 9.86.050. The City is working towards helping maintain water quality within its Parks and Open Spaces, while keeping it safe for people of all ages as well as native animals that call Black Diamond home. Pet waste has been identified as a contributor to water quality pollution and is required to be addressed through the mandates of the Clean Waters Act and the City's National Pollution Discharge Elimination System Phase II stormwater permit. Local citizens have made it very clear that they value water quality within the City of Black Diamond and want to strive to keep waters clean for everyone's use.

Although many native wild animal species have adapted well to increased urbanization throughout the Puget Sound Region, including Osprey, Bald Eagle, deer and others, their habitat, nesting sites and the animals themselves are susceptible to damage or harm from unrestrained animals and off trail use. Users of these facilities deserve the opportunity to utilize these public places in a safe manner without the fear of being chased or attacked by unrestrained pets. The Black Diamond Police Department has been asked to increase enforcement, which could include financial penalties, in order to protect its citizens, users of our Parks system and the surface water systems that these areas drain into. Thank you for your cooperation.

IMPROVEMENT PROJECT IS UNDERWAY

Welcome back to Scotty's General Construction for another sidewalk



project in Black Diamond. This project will provide a sidewalk link to the library. The Transportation Improvement Board funded the sidewalk at 90%. By the time this newsletter reaches you some sidewalk will be in place. This project will also **improve the water quality discharge** to the wetland north of Roberts Drive. Before this project the stormwater runoff from the south side of Roberts Drive discharged directly to the wetland untreated. Upon completion of the project the stormwater will be collected, treated and infiltrated back into the soil. When the project is complete plan on an evening celebratory walk to the library.

The DSHS Mobile Community Services Office (CSO) is hitting the open road to reach new clients and improve their customer service. DSHS has created two 40-foot trucks that transform into functioning offices. Black Diamond households who find the trip to their local CSO too far to travel will be able to visit the mobile offices at the Black Diamond Community Center parking lot on Thursday, September 13th from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Each Mobile CSO unit is staffed by experienced financial workers who are able to complete cash, food, and medical interviews, issue EBT cards, and receive documents. agencies. General Budget process was presented to Council at a Workstudy session on August 16, 2012; other Workstudy sessions are scheduled for Council on October 18th and 25th in the Council Chambers.

Since the revenue picture has not improved for 2012, balancing continues to be difficult as revenues are not keeping pace with increases in expenditures.

Public hearings are scheduled for November 1st, 15th and December 6th on revenues and the property tax levy. Public input is always welcomed and encouraged.
